Participants will leave with a better understanding of how to write and use a social narrative.

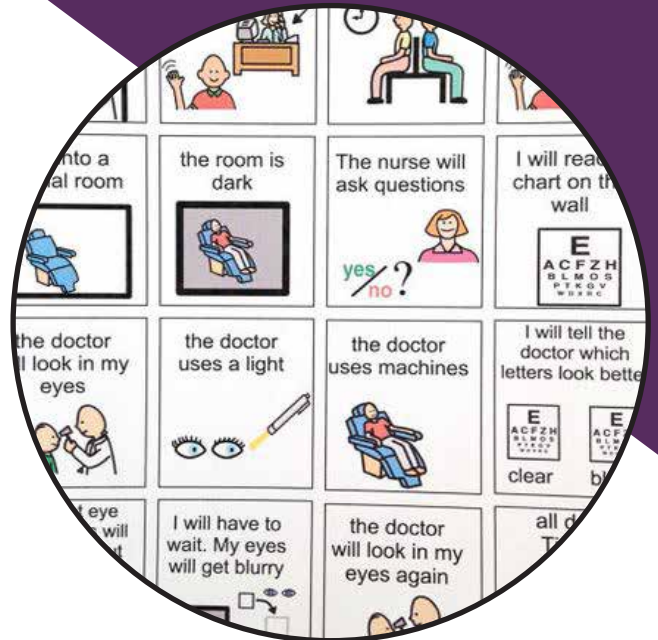


## MEET THE TRAINER: ANGELA DUFFY
