WORKSHOP

Can't or won't. Oftentimes we fall into the trap of thinking that a child with autism won't engage in an activity or with a game/toy because they don't want to. Consider the difference between what a child can't or won't do. As parents and educators, we are the ones that must think outside the box in order to promote engagement between the child and an activity. Objectives will include 1) Identify how autism impacts a child's joint attention, theory of mind and executive functioning 2) Explore how visual supports can help increase comprehension of game/activity for the child 3) Develop/plan out an adaptation for a game or learning activity.
